• Grade Forgiveness:



The Regents Bachelor of Arts (RBA) program is designed to help adults complete a college degree. The West Virginia Board of Regents (now the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission) created this unique bachelor's degree program in 1974 to meet the needs and recognize the accomplishments of adult learners.

RBA students are eligible to receive college credit for work experience, professional certifications, and military training. You qualify for the Regents program if you graduated high school at least four years ago, do not hold a baccalaureate degree, and meet Concord University's general admission requirements.

Early Childhood Regents Bachelor of Arts

The newly revised Early Childhood Regents Bachelor of Arts (ECRB) program is designed to offer individuals working in an early childhood setting an alternative way to obtain a bachelor's level degree. The ECRB program builds on previous training that early childhood paraprofessionals and others working in the early childhood field have obtained. Therefore, ECRB program participants can earn their bachelor's degree in as little as one calendar year. The ECRB course of study is completely online and allows full time working adults the opportunity to focus on one course at a time. In addition, each course has a one hour field observation embedded where participants

take the content from course work and apply it in their work setting. Graduates of the ECRB program are eligible to continue their education at the master's level to obtain a teaching license in Preschool Special Needs.
